## Governor DeWine Announces New Order Beginning May 1st

(Columbus, OH) Today, Governor Mike DeWine has announced a new order that will take effect on May 1st, 2020. As part of that order, the Governor announced that all health procedures that do not require an overnight stay in a hospital may be resumed.

While you may begin to operate a more normal schedule, you must comply with Reopening Ohio Business Plan Responsible Protocols. These include:

- No mask, no work, no service, no exception. You, your employees, and your patients must wear face masks.
- Daily health assessments must be done on employees. If anyone shows any symptoms of coronavirus, they must go home.
- Maintain good hygiene. Continue to be diligent in hand washing and not touching your face.
- Disinfect and sanitize. Be sure to continue to keep all surfaces clean, especially between patients.
- Limit capacity to meet social distancing guidelines. Everyone shall be at least 6 feet apart, where possible. The governor also stated that the maximum capacity for all businesses is set to 50% of their fire-code.

The Governor's office also provided these steps for if/when a COVID-19 infection is identified:

- Immediately report employee or customer infections to the local health district. Work with local health department to identify potentially exposed individuals to help facilitate appropriate communication/contact tracing.
- Shutdown shop/floor for deep sanitation is possible.
- Professionally clean and sanitize site/location.
- Reopen in consultation with the local health department.
- The governor has directed anyone who is not following these measures to report them to their local health department.
